## Muslim brotherhood escalates sectarian violence in response to dispersing the sitin

55 churches and Copts properties attacked and burned following to the Sit-in dispersal.

Andalus Institute for tolerance and anti-violence studies condemn the violent attacks on Copts Christians at the hands of the Muslim Brotherhood and their supporters. The attacks took place after the Egyptian security forces started to disperse the sit-in camps in Rabaa Al Adaweya and Al-Nahda in the morning of the 14<sup>th</sup> of August 2013.

Since yesterday, about 55 churches and properties belonging to Christians were attacked and burned. The violent incidents took place in 12 Egyptian Governorates<sup>1</sup>;

These attacks started following to the dispersal of Sit-in camps in Rabaa Al-Adawya and Elnahda by security forces. Previously the Muslim Brotherhood used propaganda against Christians alleging that the latter supported the overthrown of the Muslim brotherhood as a direct stab to the Islam. This propaganda came as an attempt to keep the political positions the Muslim brotherhood held after the rage of Egyptian citizens towards their policies prior to the 30 June protests. After the ousting of Morsi, the brotherhood promoted hatred speeches towards Christians accusing them to be the reason behind the so called coup d'état. It is noteworthy to mention that Morsi supporters have also attacked several churches in other governorates over the past month. Spokesmen from the brotherhood have publicly stated that the Church supports the coup d'état against legitimacy; they also claimed that all protestors who toppled Morsi are either Copts or against Shari'a.

Those violent incidents and attacks are deemed a flagrant violation to the rights of minorities and an infringement on the freedom of belief. It should be noted that Pro-Muslim Brotherhood crowds' attitude towards Christians and other minorities is severely violent and not tolerable. The violence perused by the Muslim Brother-hood does not serve their cause because peaceful sit-ins do not entail attacking civilians and churches. Those incidents could amount to acts of terrorism, not merely peaceful protests.
